## CIVIL WAR 150

hile this nation commemorates the 150th anniversary of the Civil War, the Canby Public Library plans an eight-part series of related events running Feb. 25 to April 16.

At the center is a national traveling panel exhibition which will be on display at the library Feb. 25 to March 18.

"Civil War 150" is organized by the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History in partnership with the Library of America.

#### Four parts on the Civil War

To complement the exhibit, the library is hosting a four part reading and discussion series on the Civil War, led by scholar and acclaimed Civil War novelist Lois Leveen.

The first session will be held on Tuesday, Feb. 26 at 4 p.m. Other discussions will be Tuesday, March 12, at 4 p.m., Tuesday, April 2. at 6:30 p.m. and Tuesday, April 16, at 6:30 p.m. Readings for each session will be available at the library.

#### How it happened

"As you may recall, last year, we hosted a very successful reading and discussion series focused on David McCullough's book "1776," said Penny Hummel, library director.

"Participants loved our scholar-facilitator, Lois Leveen, and asked for more. So, we applied for and received two grants to support a Civil War series in early 2013."

One grant of \$2,200 is from the Clackamas County Cultural Coalition and the Oregon Cultural Trust, who also provided support for "1776" last year. The other is a \$1,000 award from the Gilder-Lehrman Institute of American History. They also selected the Canby Public Library to host a national traveling panel exhibition called
